October 4th - Students had no school. I attended an IEP Matrix training with Toni Hunt, CFEA.

October 5th - 7th - Book fair was extended due to Hurricane Ian.

October 5th - I attended a meeting with Toni Hunt, CFEA, regarding MTSS next steps.

October 5th - I attended a Teams meeting to get an update on the Intensive Afterschool and Weekend Academies grant. It would provide funding for tutoring for literacy, and STEM.

October 12th - Progress reports were sent home to families.

October 10-14th - Toilet paper drive for the Jerry Dollinger Food Drive. We collected 148 rolls of toilet paper.

October 14th - I attended a Teams Meeting to get an update on ESSER II Supplemental Programming and ARP Supplemental Programming which will provide funding for tutoring and/or extracurricular activities.
